

ADVERTISEMENT AND INVITATION TO BID

The City of Hearne will receive bids for the San Antonio Water Pumping Station Rehabilitation (CDBG-MIT Contract No. 24-065-074-E685) until 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday, July 23, 2026, at City of Hearne City Hall, located at 209 Cedar St., Hearne, Texas 77859. Bids must be addressed to: Alonzo Garza, City Manager. The bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday, July 23, 2026, at City of Hearne City Hall, located at 209 Cedar St., Hearne, Texas 77859.

A Mandatory Pre-Bid Conference will be held in person at the City of Hearne City Hall at 209 Cedar Street, Texas 77859 at 2:00 p.m. on July 16, 2026.

Bids are invited for several items and quantities of work as follows:

Pump building rehabilitation includes new doors, new ventilation system, painting, replacing two (2) high service pumps, and electrical wiring and equipment for new components. New Prefabricated FRP Chlorine Building with all appurtenances detailed in the Drawings and Specifications. Installation of a well splash pad, miscellaneous piping, grading and drainage improvements, and site fencing improvements.

Bid/Contract Documents, including Drawings and Technical Specifications, may be viewed and downloaded free of charge at www.civcastusa.com. Bidders must register on this website to view and/or download specifications, plans, and other related documents. It is the sole responsibility of all plan holders to periodically check for the issuance of any addenda which may be posted on www.civcast.com.

A bid bond in the amount of five percent (5%) of the bid amount issued by an acceptable surety shall be submitted with each bid. A certified check or bank draft payable to the City of Hearne or negotiable U.S. Government Bonds (as par value) may be submitted in lieu of the Bid Bond.

The successful Bidder must furnish Performance and Payment Bonds each in the amount of 100% of the contract price from an approved Surety Company holding a permit from the State of Texas to act as Surety and acceptable according to the latest list of companies holding certificates of authority from the Secretary of Treasury of the United States, or other Surety or Sureties acceptable to the Owner.

The project to be constructed will be financed with assistance from the General Land Office (GLO) under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant - Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) program and is subject to all applicable Federal and State laws and regulations. Attention is called to the fact that not less than the federally determined prevailing Davis-Bacon and Related Acts wage rate, as issued by the Department of Labor and contained in the contract documents, must be paid on this project. In addition, the successful bidder must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Adherence to the City of Hearne Section 3 Policy is required for all contracts.

All contractors and subcontractors must be cleared (not suspended or debarred) prior to any formal action authorizing the award of a contract to the contractor. Minority Business Enterprises, Small Business Enterprises, Women Business Enterprises, Veteran-Owned Businesses, Section 3 Businesses, and labor surplus area firms are encouraged to submit bids.

The City of Hearne reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any informalities in the bidding. Bids may be held by the City of Hearne for a period not to exceed 60 days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and investigating the bidder's qualifications prior to the contract award.
