APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. Luminant Mining Company LLC, 6555 Sierra Drive, Irving, Texas 75039, which operates Oak Grove Lignite Mining Area, a surface lignite coal mining facility, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a major amendment of Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0002699000 to authorize renaming the following ponds and outfalls: Pond **Q-9** (Outfall 020M/R) will be revised to Pond Q-17 (Outfall 028M/R); Pond **Q-10** (Outfall 021M/R) will be revised to Pond Q-11 (Outfall 022M/R); and Pond Q-8 (Outfall 019M/R) will be revised to Pond Q-10 (Outfall 021M/R) and the addition of the following ponds and outfalls: **Pond Q-8 (Outfall 019M/R); Pond Q-9 (Outfall 020M/R);** Pond Q-11 (Outfall 022M/R); Pond Q-12 (Outfall 023M/R); Pond Q-13 (Outfall 024M/R); Pond Q-14 (Outfall 025M/R); Pond Q-15 (Outfall 026M/R); Pond Q-16 (Outfall 027M/R); Pond Q-17 (Outfall 028M/R); Pond Q-18 (Outfall 029M/R); and Pond D-14 (Outfall 030M/R). The draft permit authorizes the discharge of active mining drainage, groundwater seepage, mine pit dewatering, and stormwater runoff from active mining areas in the Kosse Mine and the Bremond Mine on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfalls 001M-003M, 005M-008M, and 010M-030M; and stormwater runoff from post-mining areas in the Kosse Mine and the Bremond Mine on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfalls 001R-003R, 005R- 008R, and 010R-030R. The TCEQ received this application on January 30, 2026.

This combined notice is being issued because two pond names were wrong and two additional ponds were not listed in the NORI.

The facility is located at 4731 State Highway 7 East, east of the City of Kosse, Limestone County, Texas 76653. The effluent is discharged via Outfalls 001 M/R, 003 M/R, 007 M/R, and 030 M/R to an unnamed tributary of Steele Creek; via Outfall 002 M/R to Heads Creek; via Outfalls 005 M/R to Willow Creek; via Outfall 006 M/R to Cox Creek; via Outfalls 008 M/R to Owens Creek; via Outfall 010 M/R to an unnamed tributary of Willow Creek, thence to Willow Creek, thence all outfalls to Steele Creek, thence to Navasota River Below Lake Limestone in Segment 1209 of the Brazos River Basin; and via Outfalls 011 M/R, 012 M/R, 013 M/R, and 015 M/R to an unnamed tributary of Walnut Creek; via Outfalls 014 M/R, 016 M/R, and 023 M/R to unnamed tributaries of Gnats Creek, thence to Gnats Creek; via Outfalls 017 M/R, 018 M/R, and 019 M/R to Gnats Creek; via Outfalls 020 M/R, 021 M/R, 024 M/R, 025 M/R, 026 M/R, 027 M/R, and 029 M/R to unnamed tributaries of Beck Creek, thence to Beck Creek; via Outfall 028 M/R to Beck Creek; via Outfall 022 M/R to Willson Creek, thence all outfalls to Walnut Creek; thence to Little Brazos River, thence to Brazos River Above Navasota River in Segment 1242 of the Brazos River Basin. The unclassified receiving water uses are minimal aquatic life use for the unnamed tributaries of Steele Creek, Walnut Creek, Gnats Creek, and Beck Creek and Beck Creek and Wilson Creek; limited aquatic life use for Heads Creek, Willow Creek, Cox Creek, and Owens Creek; and high aquatic life use for Steele Creek, Walnut Creek, and Gnats Creek. The designated uses for Segments No. 1209 and 1242 are primary contact recreation, public water supply, and high aquatic life use.

In accordance with Title 30 Texas Administrative Code Section 307.5 and TCEQ's Procedures to Implement the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards (June 2010), an antidegradation review of the receiving waters was performed. A Tier 1 antidegradation review has preliminarily determined that existing water quality uses will not be impaired by this permit action. Numerical and narrative criteria to protect existing uses will be maintained. A Tier 2 review has preliminarily determined that no significant degradation of water quality is expected in Walnut Creek, Steele Creek, or Gnats Creek, which has been identified as having intermediate high aquatic life use. Existing uses will be maintained and protected. The preliminary determination can be reexamined and may be modified if new information is received.

The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request another public meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit written or oral comment or to ask questions about the application. Generally, the TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for public comments, the Executive Director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **The response to comments, along with the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who requested to be on a mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision.** A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period; and the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period.**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The Executive Director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or a timely request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the Executive Director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and requests to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

MAILING LIST. If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be added to: (1) the permanent list for a specific applicant name and permit number; and (2) the mailing list for a specific county. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below
